Hastings Notebook Editing

Most of what is in the transcript of the Hastings Notebooks is exact transcription of what is written. Anything in red was written or drawn in red ink. There are drawings in the notebook that are recreated in the transcription up until page 78. The drawings after that need to be done. There are not many left. Footnotes are used to explain most changes in notebook.

<word>: the word was struck out in notebook in this way alternately:

[i[word]i]: the word inside brackets has been inserted, footnotes explain where unless it was inserted in an empty space between other words

<word>[i[word]i]: word inside <> was written over top of and changed to what is inside [i[]i] unless noted by a footnote

<illeqible>: the word was illegible

Editorial remarks appear in italics inside square brackets:

[On back of page #]: shows that something was written or pasted onto this page
